AAP Rule Compliance

Near Term Goals & Milestones

Achieve substantial compliance with AAPs and specifically assess all dairies by 2016

- Increase inspection resources
- Provide small farms a resources assessment to give them an opportunity to resolve issues and the State to prioritize future efforts
- Start with SFO dairies in Lake Champlain basin, then SFO dairies statewide
- Provide opportunities for partners and private industry to assist in planning and design needs.

AAP Rule Compliance

Backstops

- Set declining cost-shares to increase implementation rates
- Retain rebuttable presumption and VT WQS process
- Provide additional enforcement remedies, currently a small farm has many more opportunities before a financial penalty is assessed
- Compliance with AAPs is an enforced condition of the Current Use program

Nutrient Management

Near Term Goals & Milestones

All farms will be implementing appropriate NMP by 2020

- Need to establish who needs a NMP, (examples: 6 or more cows, 2,000lbs/ac density, in a critical source area)
- Develop NM Planning Template (simplified version of current NRCS 590 Standard more appropriate for Small Farms)
- Provide training on how to develop and implement NMPs and whole Farm Resource Management Plans for service providers
- Empower partners to hold NMP development and update classes for farmers who want to write their own
- Implement declining cost-share rates in order to encourage implementation

Backstops

 NM Planning and Resource Management Plans become required under AAPs and enforcement remedies will be applied

Livestock Exclusion from Streams

Near Term Goals & Milestones

90% of all livestock are excluded by 2018 from mapped streams

- Identify a "Stream" for the purposes of applying this rule
- Quantify the extent of the issue in order to track progress and remaining needs
- Utilize a declining cost-share rate system
- Extend partner network in order for farmers to access technical and financial assistance
- Included in Resource Management Plan assessment
- Develop a waiver process where specific circumstances do not require exclusion if well managed

Livestock Exclusion from Streams

Backstops

- Require livestock exclusion in AAPs by 2018
- Offer declining cost-share starting at 90% once enacted and then 50% cost-share for existing operations after 2018
